## Rev. King To Address Rally In Norfolk June 30

The Rev. Martin Luther King, Jr., founder - president of the Southern Christian Leadership Conference, will address a rally staged by the Virginia Christian Leadership Conference at the Norfolk Municipal Arena Friday night, June 30.

Plans for the rally were made during a meeting of churchmen at New Calvary Baptist church Wednesday. According to the Rev. Milt on B. Reid of Petersburg, president of the Virginia conference, the rally will be for the entire eastern region.

AT THE meeting Wedn e s-day, presided over by the Rev. W. L. Hamilton, Norfolk pastor and member of the executive board of the Southern conference, twelve attending churchmen were named to the steering committee for the June 30 rally.

They are Rev. Dr. Hamilton and the Revs. W. B. Wesstbrook, J. Jasper Freeman, F. P. Wise, S. P. Dixon, C. E. Griffin, J. B. Henderson, John R. Gray, William B. Abbott, A. McClanney, H. M. Henderson and D. L. Collins, Williamsburg.

PLANS CALL for a financial report from the 390 churches which expressed interest in the rally during the Ministers Conference at Hampton institute and from various groups in the Tidewater area. The proceeds will be shared by the state and national Christi an Leadership Conferences.

Rev. Dr. Reid said delegations are expected from all over Virginia and adjoining states.

THE JUNE 30 appearance will be the first at Norfolk for Rev. Dr. King. He was scheduled to have been a speaker at the meeting of the Southern Christian Leadership conference held here in October, 1958, but a few days before the event suffered wounds at the hands of a demented woman while autographing books in a New York department store.
