"WE. THE UNDERSIGNED. call you to join in a dramatic petition to the State of Virginia to maintain our public schools in compliance with the supreme law of the la'n d and the federal courts. We call on all citizens of Virginia to join their brothers in ask in g repeal of the Virginia statute that allows local communities to abandon public education in defiance of the Supreme court decision of May 17, 1954. and the granting of immediate relief to the children of Prince" Edward county who are denied access to a free public school education.

"We feel compelled to act, not only because of the federal court decisions, but primarily due to our religious and moral obligation to these children locked out of their classrooms. We, believe in the unity and brotherhood of mankind, and are irrevocably disposed to ask for the end of segregation in the free public education of The Rev. H. C. Hairston, alt children.
