JANUARY 2, 1958
FIRST BAPTIST CHURCH,
NEWPORT NEWS

At the First Baptist Church of Newport News annual Emancipation Celebration program, Dr. King gave his speech, "Facing the Challenge of a New Age."

JUNE 30, 1961
CITY ARENA, NORFOLK

At a rally sponsored by the Virginia Christian Leadership Conference, Dr. King spoke to an audience of 2,500. "If America is to remain a first class nation," he told the crowd, "it can't have second class citizens."

JUNE 26, 1962
FIRST BAPTIST CHURCH,
WILLIAMSBURG

Dr. King visited Williamsburg to address an overflow crowd at First Baptist Church on Scotland Street.

JUNE 28, 1962
FIRST BAPTIST CHURCH,
NEWPORT NEWS

Returning to Newport News for the Southern Christian Leadership Conference Fund for Freedom Drive, Dr. King spoke to an audience of 700 at First Baptist Church.

JUNE 28, 1963
UNION HALL AND
PEANUT PARK, SUFFOLK

At a rally held by the Southern Christian Leadership Conference, Dr. King gave a press conference at Union Hall on East Washington Street and a talk at Peanut Park.

OCTOBER 29, 1966
NEW CALVARY BAPTIST
CHURCH, NORFOLK

In what was described as a "whirlwind visit," Dr. King attended the installation services of Dr. Milton A. Reid at New Calvary Baptist Church, followed by a press conference with reporters and Norfolk State College students.
